



Preface of Asha Bhavan Centre

Persons with disabilities, “the world’s largest minority”, have generally poorer health, lower education achievements, fewer economic opportunities and higher rates of poverty than people without disabilities. This is largely due to the lack of services available to them and the many obstacles they face in their everyday lives. These obstacles can take a variety of forms, including those relating to the physical environment, or those resulting from legislation or policy, or from societal attitudes or discrimination.

People with disabilities are at much higher risk of violence: Factors which place people with disabilities at higher risk of violence include stigma, discrimination, and ignorance about disability, as well as a lack of social support for those who care for them.

Evidence and experience show that when barriers to their inclusion are removed and persons with disabilities are empowered to participate fully in societal life, their entire community benefits. Barriers faced by persons with disabilities are, therefore, a detriment to society as a whole, and accessibility is necessary to achieve progress and development for all.

The Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) recognizes that the existence of barriers constitutes a central component of disability. Under the Convention, disability is an evolving concept that “results from the interaction between persons with impairments and attitudinal and environmental barriers that hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others.”

Accessibility and inclusion of persons with disabilities are fundamental rights recognized by the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and are not only objectives, but also pre-requisites for the enjoyment of other rights.

Since 21 years Asha Bhavan Centre initiated various programme to bring the most underprivileged disabled community in mainstream society. We work with hand in hand with all sector of community people and motive to bring changes in the society for all. We promote opportunities to develop the potential abilities for inclusion in ongoing community, we protect the rights of the person with disabilities as a citizen of our country and facilitate to remove the barriers from society.

Vision of Asha Bhavan Centre

Asha Bhavan Centre is a landmark organisation, working with marginalized community to uphold dignity, equity and self-confidence in the society.

Mission of Asha Bhavan Centre

The mission of Asha Bhavan Centre is to create meaningful opportunities for social and economic development of the marginalized community so that they gain dignity, equity and self-confidence in life.

Objectives of Organisation

- To establish homes for the handicapped children.
- To create various activities for the Rehabilitation of disabled children.
- To establish centre for the treatment of disabled children and their families.
- To establish medical centre for the ailing people of the locality.
- To organize seminars, conference about different man killer diseases.
- To give stipend, scholarship, school books to the poor students of the locality.
- To establish Balwadi School, night schools, library, coaching centre for the benefit of the students.
- To establish vocational training centre for self – employment of the poor women, school drop young boys and disabled persons.
- To organize village peace corps.
- To establish homes for the destitute, orphans and old invalid persons.
- To collect donations and subscriptions to run the Society.
- To establish centre for cultivation, grocery, embroidery etc. for the benefit of the poor people.
- To help young men in their physical culture through sports, games, drills, exercise, traveling, training camp etc.
- To act any other welfare activities which the committee thinks fit by adopting Proper Resolution.
- To construct, maintain, improve, develop and other any building, homes or other works necessary or convenient for the use of the society.

About the CCI Children's Home Under ICPS

There are many children in this country who lack a stable home and family. These include abandoned, surrendered and trafficked children, orphans, as well as children with families that are unable to look after them. These children in need of care and protection are placed in child care institutions such as children's homes, open shelters, observation homes, special homes, places of safety, and specialised adoption agencies.

The National Policy for Children 2013 reiterates India's commitment to such children in accordance with the Convention on the Rights of the Child. It states that "the State shall endeavour to secure the rights of children temporarily or permanently deprived of parental care, by ensuring family and community-based care arrangements with due regard to the best interests of the child and guaranteeing quality standards of care and protection".

Asha Bhavan Centre join the hand with state and run Child Care Institutions- Children's Home for CWSN girls at Kathila, Banitabla, Uluberia, Howrah, 711316 under the ICPS project. The Child Care Institution Children's Home for 300 Girls Children with Special Need under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) act, 2015. At present we received sanction of 2 unit that is for 100 girl children at Kathila. Both the Centre cater the special needs of each individual and prepare them to mainstream in the society. During the financial year 2019-2020 we are provide necessary care, protection and rehabilitation programme for the 101 CWSN girls throughout a multidisciplinary approach and individually based programme.

After receiving Special Education and formal education now she is able to write her own name, able to read Bengali sentence, able to say name of weeks/months and also she can follow clock time. Day by day she is improving in badminton game.

Jahira has lots of potentialities to develop and to become independent in life. She was participated in State Game Badminton of Special Olympic Bharat, West Bengal at Salt Lake Stadium. She stood 1st position in upper ability. We all hope she will show her excel and will be a good player in future and our best wishes are always with her.



Asha Bhavan Centre join the hand with state and run Child Care Institutions- Children's Home for CWSN girls at Keoradanga, Betheria, Bishnupur, South 24 Parganas under the ICPS project. The Child Care Institution Children's Home for 100 Girls Children with Special Need under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) act, 2015. At present we received sanction of one unit that is for 50 girl children with special need. The Centre cater the special needs of each individual and prepare them to mainstream in the society. During the financial year 2019-2020 we are provide necessary care, protection and rehabilitation programme for the 35 CWSN girls throughout a multidisciplinary approach and individually based programme.

Special School for Children with Special Need

Special schools for children with disability are different from regular schools in that they cater to students with education challenges. Special School is designed, staffed, and have the resources to provide the right support for children with unique needs. This school aim to level the playing field. We offer students targeted support to allow them to meet age-appropriate educational goals.

The Special school of Asha Bhavan Centre don't have a "one-size-fits-all" approach to education. Instead, we offer customized programming to meet each student's unique combination of needs. This includes not just learning, but also social and emotional needs.

Since 2017 Asha Bhavan Centre's Special School for children with Intellectual disability receive gran-in-aids from Department of Disability Affairs under the DDRS scheme for 60 children with ID.

We also run the same facility of special education for children with Cerebral Palsy, Hearing Impaired, Multiple Disabilities and Autism, Down syndrome under the support of ADL foundation, through this school we provide support to 72 children.



Orthopaedic Workshop

Many people with disabilities depend on assistive devices to enable them to carry out daily activities and participate actively and productively in community life. Access to assistive devices is essential for many people with disabilities and is an important part of any development strategy. Without assistive devices, people with disabilities may never be educated or able to work, so the cycle of poverty continues.

The Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, Articles 4, 20 and 26, asks States to promote the availability of appropriate devices and mobility aids and provide accessible information about them.

In our country only 5–15% of people who require assistive devices and technologies have access to them. In Indian context the production is low and often of limited quality, there are very few trained personnel and costs may be prohibitive.

To fill the gap of supply and demand especially in rural community Asha Bhavan Centre, established the workshop to produce various kind of low-cost high-tech aids and appliances and mobility devises. The workshop functioning more than a decade to manufacture and distributed need-based aids and appliances for the person with disability. We provide those materials to the person with disabilities throughout the country to make them enable to become a participatory member of the society. During the year we distribute aids and appliances to 195 children with disabilities and persons with disabilities.

Community Based Rehabilitation Department

The aim of community-based rehabilitation (CBR) is to help people with disabilities, by establishing community-based medical integration, equalization of opportunities, and therapeutic rehabilitation programs for the disabled. The strength of CBR programs is that it can be made available in rural areas, with limited infrastructure, as program leadership is not restricted to professionals in healthcare, educational, Physiotherapy, Occupational therapy vocational or social services. Rather, CBR programs involve the people with disabilities themselves, their families and communities, as well as appropriate professionals.

CBR activities of Asha Bhavan Centre are designed to meet the basic needs of people with disabilities, reduce poverty, and enable access to health, education, livelihood and social opportunities – all these activities fulfil the aims of the CRPD.

CBR programmes provide a link between people with disabilities and development initiatives. The CBR programme target the key sectors of development that need to become inclusive so that people with disabilities and their families become empowered, contributing to an inclusive society or 'society for all'.

Success Story of Ankita:

Ankita is 8 Yrs 7 months old girl child with Cerebral Palsy; she is one of the twins, her brother died after two days of birth. Doctor said Ankita did not cry immediately after birth, she had low birth weight (1.250kg). She also suffered due to lack of oxygen leading to Asphyxia causing brain damage resulting Cerebral Palsy.

Ankita is from joint family comprised of 9 members from Jadurberia village, under Uluberia block of Howrah district. She has elder brother, studying at class VII. Father earns about 5000/-approximately per month.

Ankita was brought to ABC at the age of 4 years, at that time she was able to control her head and learning to sit. Rest she was dependent on her mother for all functional areas such as eating, drinking, toileting, washing, bathing etc. Mother was confused about her problems and came seeking for treatment.

Asha Bhavan Centre's staffs initiated her management programmes after detailed assessment, covering all her need areas, including preschool skills with periodical review and updating her profile and modified the programmes as and when required.

After receive the rehabilitation services since 4 ½ years now Ankita is able to walk with crutches and special shoes (A.F.O). She has been attending to mainstream school about 2 kilometer away from her house and read in class-I . Now she has learned to eat with hand and drink from a glass on her own. She is toilet trained and goes to toilet room on her own. She is independent in washing her faces and brush teeth. She enjoys bathing and participate bathing by following instructions. She enjoys play with dolls and pretends as mother taking responsibility for washing, feeding, teaching the doll.

Ankita's mother Tulu Pal is changed from previous and she motivated with confident and happy. Experiencing the progress made by her daughter the mother is hopeful the Ankita will continue studying and will be able to achieve higher education.

LEAP CP Project

In collaboration with the Queensland University of Australia Our team has developed the LEAP-CP Program (Learning through Everyday Activities with Parents of infants with Cerebral Palsy), which adapts the clinical practice guideline to respond to these unique challenges facing families of a child with CP living in our community. The LEAP-CP model includes both early detection and early intervention which have been specifically tailored for the context. The early detection strategy utilises the General Movements Assessment (GMs) and Hammersmith Infant Neurological Examination (HINE), two gold standard early detection tools based on systematic review. In conjunction with LEAP-CP, Community Disability Workers (CDWs) have been effectively trained to collect GMs and HINE videos through community-based screening, which are subsequently scored by experienced raters. During this year 62 babies have been screened to date, with excellent inter-rater reliability for both GMs and HINE. Among the screened babies we found 23 babies in high risk of CP. Two Community Disabled worker engaged to provide community-based intervention of active goal-directed strategies and environmental enrichment, delivered peer to peer in the home.

DISHA Early Intervention and school readiness program

This is a The National Trust scheme aims to provide early intervention for Children with Disability (CwD) in 0-10 years of age covered under the National Trust Act, through therapies, special education, trainings and providing support to family members. Asha Bhavan Centre is providing day-care facilities to CwD for 6 hours in a day along with age specific activities. Through the DISAH centre we reached 26 children with disabilities during this year.



NIRAMAYA Health Insurance Scheme

NIRAMAYA an affordable Health Insurance scheme to PwDs of the National Trust run by Asha Bhavan Centre. This is a single premium across age band Health insurance cover of up to Rs. 1.0 lakh. All persons with disabilities under the National Trust Act with valid disability certificate will be eligible and included in this scheme. This scheme cover the facility for OPD treatment including the medicines, pathology, diagnostic tests, etc, Regular Medical check-up for non-ailing disabled, Dental Preventive Dentistry, Surgery to prevent further aggravation of disability, Non- Surgical/ Hospitalization, Corrective Surgeries for existing Disability including congenital disability, Ongoing Therapies to reduce impact of disability and disability related complications, Alternative Medicine.

Till the date we enrolled 174 persons with disability in this NIRAMAYA Health Scheme and many of them get benefit in their treatment.

State Nodal Agency Centre West Bengal

Since June 2017 Asha Bhavan Centre working as the State Nodal Agency centre of The National Trust for West Bengal Sate. Through the SNAC we reached to all 23 district administration and make convergence with them to the National Trust. We successfully formed the State Level Coordination Committee chaired by the Secretary, Department of women and child Development and Social Welfare, Government of west Bengal and member secretary the State commissioner of Disabilities, Government of West Bengal along with other members. We conducted various meeting with State government to facilitate the scheme of the National Trust and promote LLC formation and promotion of the NIRAMAYA health Scheme throughout the state. We also work closely with 49 National Trust Registered Organization to implement the objectives of the National Trust for the well-being of the person with disabilities. In spite of State Level Coordination Committee meeting we organized two Registered Organization Meet and many LLC meeting with the districts administration.



The National Trust Registered Organization Meet – As a part of The State Nodal Agency Centre, activity we organized two meetings with the registered organization under the National Trust. 1st Meet held on 13th February 2020 at the training hall of Asha Bhavan Centre's Head office at Kathila, Uluberia, Howrah. Representative of 22 The National Trust organized the Registered Organizations of South Bengal were participated in the meeting, and 2nd Meet On 24th February 2020 at Siliguri for the registed organization of South Bengal Districts. 21 people were participated in the programme, which placed in the meeting Hall of North Bengal Handicapped Rehabilitation Society in Siliguri. In these programme we discussed various issues of The National Trust focusing the activity of Local Level Committee (LLC) and online process of LLC formation and Legal Guardianship and Niramaya Health Scheme. The meet successfully completed with the support from the office of The State Commissioner for person with disabilities, Women and Child development and Social Welfare Department, Government of West Bengal and Various District Administration. The Sate Commissioner of Disabilities and the District Social Welfare officers from various districts were actively participated in these two programme.



Dispensary Out Patient Department

Community based health promotion emphasizes primary prevention and population based perspective. It is the goal of community health to have individuals in a certain community improve their lifestyle or seek medical attention. Primary healthcare is provided by health professionals, specifically the ones a patient sees first that may refer them to secondary or tertiary care.

Primary prevention refers to the early avoidance and identification of risk factors that may lead to certain diseases and disabilities. Community focused efforts including treatment, teaching, and awareness campaigns are all good examples of how primary prevention techniques are utilized by communities to change certain health behaviours.

Asha Bhavan Centre run Community health services in its Kathila campus and provide General Medical, Psychiatric Treatment, Malnutrition Programme and Health awareness programme for the rural population of Howrah district and South 24 Parganas District. During the Year 1,682 number of patients received the treatment through Kathila Dispensary and 627 number of patient received services through keoradanga dispensary.



Supplementary Nutrition Program

Supplementary Nutrition is an important approach for prevention and treatment of malnutrition among children, pregnant women, and lactating mothers. It is being implemented in Asha Bhavan Centre in the past two decades and we reached thousands of children and mother in the rural area of Howrah District.

The first 1000 days of a child's life are a critical window of opportunity for preventing undernutrition and its long-term consequences. Growth faltering occurs within this period (from 6–24 months of age), when a child starts to transition from breastfeeding to complementary feeding. Children in this age group have high nutrient requirements and therefore need high nutrient-dense complementary foods. In low-resource settings, a child's nutrient requirements are rarely satisfied. Furthermore, basic complementary feeding practices are poor. Behaviour change communication, along with food, is also in our intervention for improving complementary feeding practices. Hundred number of malnourished children received supplementary nutritional food with this project.

Education Project

Poverty is one of the most critical and common problems in rural India. This is also one of the major obstructions in propelling the quality education in rural India. This problem can be solved only if free education or education at very minimal fee is being offered. This is certainly going to bring up the literacy rate as more and more parents will be eager to send their kids to schools if they are not required to bear the expenses of their education.

Fortunately, with the changing times, the changes are being witnessed in the rural society as well. There is an increase in the number of parents in rural India who understand the importance of education in their children's lives. However, there exists a problem of lack of ample number of schools in India. Even if the private schools are established, they are beyond the pocket of common people because of being overtly expensive.

Asha Bhavan Centre try to find the solution and took an initiative to establish affordable schools which are pocket-friendly to the middle as well as lower economic groups of the society. We established 10 such school in the remote places of West Bengal and prepare the educational foundation of more than 2000 children every year for the future of Nation. In last year 2403 number of students enrolled.



St. Teresa's School

To follow the present trend of education and make modern educational system available in rural area we established an English Medium school at Village Brindabanpur, Block Chandipur, Dist. Purba Medinipur. At present we have 94 students who are enjoying the education with professional trained teacher and with a joyful learning environment.

Supplementary Education Program

Supplementary education can be defined as all out-of-school learning. Particularly classes focused on the provision of additional support for curriculum subjects. The rich children get extra coaching through paid tuition classes whereas this facilitation is denied to poor children mostly in rural area. Hence, they stay behind in education which ultimately ends in school drop-outs.

In order to help the poor children, Asha Bhavan Centre run 31 supplementary coaching centres with free of cost in Howrah district which is helping 857 poor students to be benefited. It is found out that these centres will immensely help the poor children in pursuing their education and promote their performances. Beside the school education support the students of these centres being trained in good health principles, hygiene practices and civic behaviours along with the moral education.



RCI Approved Training Centre D.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Intellectual Disability)

Asha Bhavan Centre successfully running the course of Rehabilitation Council of India recognized, the Diploma in Education in Special Education – Intellectual Disability (D.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ID) is a two-year intensive training programme for those interested in developing a career in special needs, with a particular focus on Mental Retardation.

This program focuses on providing students with the practical skills and knowledge they need to work with special needs individuals, providing basic care and teaching life skills, behaviour moderation, and social skills. Students learn how to prepare and organize lesson plans, classroom management skills, and behaviour management strategies to implement in a special needs classroom.

Asha Bhavan Centre has an extremely experienced pool of experts to train the students enrolled in this course. The training gives equal emphasis on both the theoretical and practical aspects of working with individuals on the Mental Retardation. The trainees learn through various modes like workshops, talks/lectures by experts, field visits, assignments, videos, as well as practical 'hands on' exposure, etc.

Women participation and empowerment are fundamental women's rights to enabling women to have control over their lives and put forth influence in society. Women often face discrimination and gender inequalities, with some women experiencing multiple discrimination and exclusion because of factors such as background, disability or caste. According India's constitution, women are legal citizens of the country and have equal rights with men. Because of lack of acceptance from the male dominant society, Indian women suffer immensely.

Vocational Training programme of Asha Bhavan Centre aim to provide skills and confidence to women from economically backward families and help them to achieve economic and social independence. By providing vocational training to the girls and women especially women with disabilities, we help them a step further so that they could do things on their own and earn their bread. With the vocational training, women can start their businesses, they can make and sell things from home, they can get jobs in manufacturing units, etc.

Training & Orientation Program

Awareness Generation and Publicity Program

Awareness Generation and Publicity Scheme (AGP), an Umbrella scheme for implementation of Persons with Disabilities, Act, 2016 (SIPDA), Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

Asha Bhavan Centre Organized four such programme on Awareness Generation and Publicity Scheme (AGP), in collaboration with District Social Welfare Section, Office of the District Magistrate and Collector, Howrah, Government of West Bengal. Block, Panchayati and District level representative, Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Parents of Children with Special Needs and media personnel have attended and graced the program.

In these AGP programme various resources person discussed the issues on Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. The Provisions enacted in the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. Rights and Benefits mentioned in the Act and highlighted the benefits of Persons with Disabilities provided in the govt. Social Welfare schemes and shows accessible ways to avail benefits by PWDs. We also discussed the possible causes and preventive measure of Disability and available intervention methods. The parent's aspect and future prospective of the PwDs, economic empowerment of PwDs through vocational training and placement also bring under the discussion. The end question answer session conducted where participants discussed various issues and problems related to the disabled persons. The facilitator try to solve with the available resources of the area.

Job Fair was arranged under the auspices of e- commerce enterprise Flipkart, who in the program venue interviewed job seekers.
