Mrs. Sukeshi Barui a social worker of a rural community with her more than 42 years of experience working in rural community realized the needs of the person with disabilities. She had a dream and commitment to work hard & stand by for the cause and uphold their dignity, equity and self respect in the society. Her dream turn into a reality only because of wholehearted support with understanding by a great French author cum philanthropist Padma Bhushan Dominique Lapierre and Mrs. Lapierre. His understanding of the cause and support became instrumental from the inception of 19 years. His support became a turning point and created a meaningful opportunities for the person with disabilities towards developing an inclusive society. The organization started functioning with a residential care centre for children with disabilities in a remote village in India.

The organisation has been promoting rehabilitation services, providing opportunities and protecting the rights of the children, women and person with disabilities in India since 1999. Thousands of people has been benefitted and rehabilitated through this organization.

Asha Bhavan Centre also recognized by Department of Woman and Child Development & Social Welfare, Government of West Bengal. Our best efforts to take care of children, women and person with disabilities by establishing Child Care Institution- Children's Home under the Juvenile Justice (care and protection of children) act, 2015. We provide Special Education, Medical services, Therapeutic Management Programmes, Aids & appliances, Vocational Training for the CWSN Girls.

The services include Community Based Rehabilitation Program, Inclusive School, Non-formal Education, and Nutritional Support, our Vocational Training Unit Empanelled as Trainer Agency of West Bengal Swarojgar Corporation Limited, GoWB.

Asha Bhavan Centre (ABC) runs formal professional courses Diploma in Education Special Education approved by Rehabilitation Council of India. Govt. of India.

Asha Bhavan Centre recognized by National Trust Govt. of India as "State Nodal Agency Centre" (SNAC) in West Bengal. ABC running the following National Trust Programmes "Disha" an Early Intervention and school readiness scheme and "Sohyagi" Care Associate Training Scheme, "Niramaya" Health Insurance scheme, "Badhte Kadam" Community Awareness and Innovative project scheme and also runs a Special School for Mental Retardation Children with Disabilities.

ABC also got recognition from Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities. Under DDRS we are running Special School for Children with Disabilities.

Asha Bhavan Centre's Initiatives:

Dominique Lapierre Home for Children with Disabilities, Kathila, Howrah:

Children with disabilities, have the right to be safe, to receive person-centered, high quality services and supports and to have access to the services they need in order to maximize independence and choice and enable them to lead a fulfilling life. This basic right is fundamental to their wellbeing and healthy development.

Children who live in residential services of Asha Bhavan Centre are enjoying a good quality of life and live in a place that feels like home, one that upholds their personal dignity and respects their privacy. The services provide a range of opportunities to foster relationships, participate in the community, both within the service and in the wider society. Children who are receiving various kind of rehabilitation services being enabled to engage in life-enhancing activities. They are supported by trained staff with whom they can communicate easily, who respect their individuality, dignity and privacy and who are sensitive to their aspirations and needs.

Asha Bhavan Centre always keep in mind of the unique social and developmental needs of the children, and their different requirements as they grow, develop and mature from childhood into adulthood.

To empower and enable children with disabilities to achieve these rights, all the services adopted a child-centered approach which supports the delivery of high quality, safe and effective care.

Our home is recognized as Child Care Institution (CCI) Children's Home for Girls Children With Special Need under the Juvenile Justice (care and protection of children) act, 2015 at Vill- Kathila, P.O.: Banitabla, P.S.: Uluberia, Dist.: Howrah, Pin 711316. At the end of March, 2018 we provide institutional care support to 105 CWSN Girls (Including 12 CWSN Girls under ICPS and residential 59 CWSN Girls under DDRS).

Dipti, Story of Change:

Dipti Koley is 22 years old lady with Cerebral Palsy (Diaplegic) 65% disabilities. Her family resides at Biki Hakola village which is one of the interior areas of Howrah district and belongs below poverty line. She lived together with her parents and siblings. Dipti's mother was expired when she was 7 years old. Her father seemed rudderless, tired and confused with the situation. how to manage domestic work and how to look after his daughter. He knew from a well-wisher about Asha Bhavan Centre which is in Vill.-Kathila, P.S.-Uluberia, Howrah. Dipti's father brought her to Asha Bhavan Centre at her age of 8 years and admitted. In the beginning she was fully dependent on others for her daily living activities and dependent on others for standing and walking as well. After admission in our residential home she was provided physiotherapy support on a regular basis. Owing to continuous Rehabilitation Therapy she gained her strength on standing and walking. Seeing her development she was admitted in a nearby Govt. primary school. Gradually she developed her academic career overcoming her disability and passed this year's Madhyamik examination with C Grade. Dipti is now smart and confident for further development and looking ahead to continue her education. Teachers and special educators of Asha Bhavan are providing on going need based support to her for overall development including education. We have a great hope that her continuous effort and her hard work will certainly help her to move towards a bright career.



Dominique Lapierre School of Excellence for Children with Special Needs:

Children, with learning disabilities are often neglected and looked down upon by the society. They often receive negative feedback from schools and hence refuse to develop positive cognitions to the outside world.

Considering their fundamental rights to education, Asha Bhavan Centre promotes opportunity of developing individual potential for receiving education through Special School.

Special education of Asha Bhavan centre basically refers to "educational programs and practices designed for students- who are intellectually disabled and hence require special teaching approaches, equipment or care within or outside a regular classroom."

We believe in rights of people with disabilities, like other children, children with disabilities, too have the right to receive proper education that helps them to grow and enjoy without fearing it.

At the end of March, 2018 we provide Special Education support to 129 children with disabilities (Divyangjan).

School of Excellence for Children with Special Need



Sabenur Khatun a story of change: She had taken birth at the remote village at the very needy family of East Midnapur district. Prematurity and low birth weight made her a victim of brain damage which leads her to a girl with intellectual disability. The parents search here and there for her support to flourish her potentialities but they undone to enroll her in any place for education. At last the parents get information about the Special School of Asha Bhavan Centre and in January 2014 she admitted in residential special school services.

After one month again, assessment was done on 03.02.14. Thus recorded her ability, interest and preliminary development of continuing regular class and outdoor activities. So in the meantime by conducting comprehensive continuous Evaluation for several years, the group of special educators decided to propose the management for her transition to the local inclusive school as her capacity in different domains, had been developed in satisfactory level of inclusion. Initiative was taken and Sabenur was admitted at neighborhood normal school, on the month of January 2015, she was enrolled at Kathila Primary School at class-I.

She responded sincerely and adjusted in the classroom environment with peer group and co-operative learning by enhancing her ability with the learning experience of formal and non-formal schooling. Her parent become very pleased for her maintaining and capacity building of socialization in the new atmosphere parents become more responsible to guide and support their dear daughter as per instructions of normal and special teachers.

According to opinion of special teachers of ABC it was stated that the CWSN was in the real meaning an exceptional child and they were proud of her by taking hardship and enjoying better experience of reconstruction.

Presently she has been promoted at class-IV at the same school without any inconvenience or inconsistency. After the final examination (evaluation), she has passed in every subject. Now she is very happy to continue her education during the present session at class-IV.

She had developed her communication; numerical vernacular and language skills up to mark. Above all, her socialization and adjustment skills have been augmented specially.

In future we are sure she will also achieve what she wanted which will add the glory of Asha Bhavan Centre. She could be able to make success in venturing skills to have an independent living and taking responsibility of family and society as other citizen of India.



Dominique Lapierre Orthopedic Workshop:

A Significant number of people with disability need special equipment for their mobility but they remain unreached due to unavailability of such services in the rural community. To facilitate the mobility and physical development, in 2005 Asha Bhavan Centre started its workshop. The workshop provides aids and appliances to the person with disabilities to improve their condition and promote participation in the society. The workshop provides the materials through its campus and through mobile camps in remote location of the state. Since 12 years of functioning we reached thousands of person with disability with their necessary special equipment.

Dominique Lapierre Home For Children With Disabilities, Keoradanga, 24 Parganas (S):

In response to the need of an intensive Child Care Institution (CCI) Children's Home service in the district of south 24 Parganas Asha Bhavan Centre started its 2nd CCI for 100 Girls Children With Special Need under the Juvenile Justice (care and protection of children) act, 2015 at Keoradanga village of this district. With the skilled knowledge of the multidisciplinary professionals and individual programme planning we are trying to improve the quality of life of girls children with disabilities. At the end of March, 2018 we are providing institutional care support to 13 CWSN Girls.



Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR):

The medical model and the social model are often presented as dichotomous, but disability should be viewed neither as purely medical nor as purely social: persons with disabilities can often experience problems arising from their health condition. A balanced approach is needed, giving appropriate weight to the different aspects of disability.

The ICF (international Classification of Functioning), adopted as the conceptual frame work for this World report on disability, understands functioning and disability as a dynamic interaction between health conditions and contextual factors, both personal and environmental. Promoted as a "bio-psycho-social model", it represents a workable compromise between medical and social models.

Understanding the concept ABC started its CBR programme in the remote places of the districts of west Bengal. The project started therapeutic and special educational intervention programme to the children with disability in the community involving parents from beginning to end as an equal partner of the rehabilitation process. This project also ensures the empowerment of parents and family, community mobilization and opportunity of the children with disabilities in the community.

The Preamble to the CRPD acknowledges that disability is "an evolving concept", but also stresses that "disability results from the inter action between persons with impairments and attitudinal and environmental barriers that hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others". Negative attitudes and behaviors have an adverse effect on children and adults with disabilities, leading to negative consequences such as low self-esteem and reduced participation. Community-based rehabilitation (CBR) programmes can challenge negative attitudes in rural communities, leading to greater visibility and participation by people with disabilities.

The team CBR organized massive Awareness Programmes, workshops, training programmes for grass root level workers, Skill development trainings of parents and care giver to over come the barriers from the society.

Story of Afrin Khatun: In 10th January 2012, Afrin Khatun was born in premature with 600 gram (1.32 pound) birth weight. This birth prematurity also lead her birth asphyxia and finally causing brain damage. As a result Afrin is a victim of Cerebral Palsy.

Afrin belongs to an extended family of Baikuntpur village of Howrah district. Her Father work as a daily labour and is the only earning member of the family having three person.

Afrin was brought to ABC at the age of one year nine months. When she comes first she was able to control head and learning to sit. Rest she was dependent on her mother for all functional areas such as eating, drinking, toileting, washing, bathing etc. Mother was confused about her problem and come seeking for medical treatment. ABC staff initiated her management programme after assessment, covering all her need area. Few year after Afrin was converted in DISHA project in July 2017. She learnt pre-school skill with periodical review and updating her profile, modified programme when required.

At present Afrin is able to walk with special shoes (AFO). Now she has learned to eat with hand and drink from a glass on her own. She is toilet trained and goes to toilet room on her own and passes stool and urine in squatting position. However she needs help for washing her faces and brush teeth. She can maintain good social manner. She has awareness of personal grooming and skill of working in a peer group.

She is attending to mainstream school about one km away from her house. She reads in class I at Baikuntapur primary school. She participates various cultural programme at school and enjoy the class with peer groups.



Identification and Intervention project of Infant high risk with Cerebral Palsy:

In collaboration with The Queensland University, Australia, Asha Bhavan Centre implementing a research project on Parent centered Identification and Intervention project of Infant (3 months to 12 months) high risk with Cerebral Palsy. We are working in three blocks (Uluberia –I, Bagnan-II and Shayampur –II) of Howrah district. Within one year period we screened 270 babies with high risks pregnancy within those three blocks area, among those 270 babies we find 45 babies having high risk of cerebral palsy. The project namely called Community-based parent delivered early detection and intervention program for infants at high risk of cerebral palsy in a low-resource country (Learning through Everyday Activities with Parents (LEAP-CP)).

This study is a randomized, double-blinded controlled trial of a novel multi-domain goal-directed play-based intervention compared to health advice. A selected total of 42 infants at high risk of CP ('absent fidgety' on the General Movements (GMs) Assessment or 'abnormal score' on the Hammersmith Infant Neurological Examination (HINE)) aged 12-40 weeks corrected age (C.A.) for the study intervention. Infants and their caregivers receive 15 fortnights of home visits by a peer trainer (Community Disability Worker). These visits include therapeutic modules (goal-directed active motor/ cognitive strategies and LEAP-CP games) and parent educational modules (Learn, Love, Grow).

The LEAP-CP intervention is a multi-domain family-centred best practice intervention consisting of infant goal-directed therapeutic strategies and learning games, and caregiver educational modules. It is based on effectiveness shown in systematic reviews and early intervention trials. The components shown necessary for effective interventions for infants with CP include (i) goal-directed tasks; (ii) home-based delivery; and include (iii) active motor learning and (iv) enriched environments. LEAP-CP is based on a parent coaching model which promotes caregiver problem solving and self-determination.



Dispensary (Out Patient Department):

Poverty is a major cause of ill health and a barrier to accessing health care when needed. This barrier is financial: the poor cannot afford to purchase those things that are needed for good health, including sufficient quantities of quality food and health care. But, the barrier is also related to other factors related to poverty, such as lack of information on appropriate health-promoting practices or lack of voice needed to make social services work for them.

The Dispensary provides the medical facilities for better health among villagers, by running an outpatient medical unit in its Kathila and Keoradanga campus. Community members get general and mental health service facilities including medicines and awareness regarding health seeking behavior from this project. As such, the project contributes to creating awareness about healthy society.

Supplementary Nutrition Programme:

Malnutrition is the one of the major causes of disability and to prevent this, Asha Bhavan Centre has taken initiative to serve the poor malnourished children through Supplementary Nutrition Project. Through this program we provide balanced supplementary nutritious food. During this period we support 79 malnourished children.



Education Project Chain of BVM School:

The role of Asha Bhavan Centre's education project is to ensure the broad-based development of pupils. This means ensuring that all pupils are able to develop their cognitive, social, emotional, cultural and physical skills to the best of their abilities, preparing them for their further school career. Carrying out this task places demands on a school's structure, teachers, school leaders and parents. We also give effort to the parents and the guardian to understand the value of education and continue the study of their child as higher as their potentialities. We are working with such group of people where cultivation and labour is the livelihood where a cultivator or a labour would think that his son should help him in his work rather than go to school and waste his time over books that would not enable him to earn more. They think that education is a luxury which the 'gentleman/rich man' can alone afford. We work hard to make such parents aware of the benefits of education.

Ayan Debnath, a brilliant ex-student of Bodhoday Vidya Mandir, Katwa, Dist. Purba Bardhaman completed his Primary school education in the year, 2012. Since beginning of his academic career Ayan has to overcome many odds. His father is an assistant teacher of Bodhoday Vidya Mandir. With his meager income Ayan's father has to manage daily living expenses of a family of six members. As a result Ayan never gets enough financial support from his father for his education. Despite this adversity that can potentially pull students down, it has had a reverse effect on Ayan. He recognizes that education can prove to be the biggest liberator. He never wasted any time and paid full attention on his education. Always achieved 1st division rank in all examinations of primary and Upper primary level examinations. Now he is studying at class x at Bharati Bhavan High School of Katwa. Supports provided by Asha Bhavan Centre together with proper guidance of teachers of Bodhoday Vidya Mandir and High school makes Ayan proficient in his education. Asha Bhavan Centre hopes with this supportive school environment and the indomitable tenacity that Ayan possesses will help him to achieve a shining career overcoming all barriers in life. Asha Bhavan is proud of him.



Supplementary Education programme:

In recent decades India has made significant progress on access to schooling and enrollment rates in primary education but dropout rates and low levels of learning remain challenges for the state and central government.

Despite these improvements, keeping children in school through graduation is still an issue and dropout rates continue to be high. Nationally 29 percent of children drop out before completing five years of primary school, and 43 percent before finishing upper primary school. High school completion is only 42 percent. This lands India among the top five nations for out-of-school children of primary school age, with 1.4 million 6 to 11 year olds not attending school.

Keeping their motto of rural reconstruction in mind, Asha Bhavan Centre took aims to eradicate school drop outs by offering specialized coaching to school attendees aged 3-10 years. Today, we have 31 coaching centers, which provide educational support to the needy 988 students of rural Howrah. They received quality education from ABC with 31 trained teachers available on a regular basis.



“SADHANA” Vocational Skill Development Centre”:

Though many programmes are available for the rural poor, more needs to be done to help the poorest of the poor - rural person with disabilities (Divyangjan). Many rural persons with disabilities are forced to go to the city for rehabilitation or livelihood training. More rehabilitation programmes for the disabled are needed in the rural areas. Poor farmers with disabilities, with or without land, need to generate income or supplementary income to become active participants in their family and community, thus reducing the burden of their disability on both family and society. More opportunities must be provided to enable disabled persons in rural areas to generate income and become self-reliant.

The Vocational Training Centre's professionals have designed the curriculum not just keeping in view the trainees' individual capabilities, but also their personal interest, parental support and resources available to meet the current demands

“SADHANA” Vocational Skill division of Asha Bhavan Centre inspired by the thought of Professor Dr. Sankarnath Mukherjee upon the process by which a person with disabilities (Divyangjan) and also economically backward person is enabled to secure suitable employment that can be retained in the long-run and advance a permanent base with an ultimate aim of integrating or re-integrating the person to the societal mainstream. Asha Bhavan Centre trainees with timely guidance from professionals have demonstrated their innovative ability linked to various skills like recycle paper product, Beautician Training, tailoring, Art and crafts.

Purba Medinipur. At present we have 84 students who are enjoying the education with professional trained teacher and with a joyful learning environment.



Child Care Institution Children's Home under ICPS:

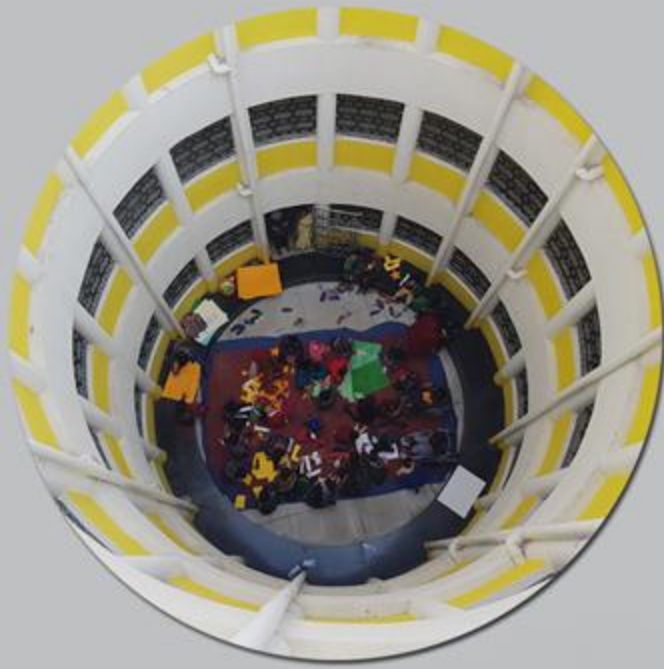
'Child Protection' is about protecting children from or against any perceived or real danger or risk to their life, their personhood and childhood. It is about reducing their vulnerability to any kind of harm and ensuring that no child falls out of the social safety net and that those who do, receive necessary care, protection and support so as to bring them back into the safety net. While protection is a right of every child, some children are more vulnerable than others and need special attention. The Government recognizes these children as 'children in difficult circumstances', characterised by their specific social, economic and geo-political situations. In addition to providing a safe environment for these children, it is imperative to ensure that all other children also remain protected. This is because Child protection is integrally linked to every other right of the child.

In this year we get approval to run Child Care Institute as a Children's Home at Kathila, Howrah for one unit (50 Girls Children with Special Need) under Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) of Ministry of Women & Child Development, Government of India. At the end of March, 2018 we provide institutional care support to 12 CWSN Girls.



Deendayal Disabled Rehabilitation Scheme (DDRS):

Special schools are meant to provide for residential as well as non-residential care with the end objective of bringing about feasible improvement in the lives of the persons with disability (Divyangjan) through acquiring skills as basic activities of daily living to their integration into regular institutions of learning and society in general. Special educational inputs are expected to bring about behavioral changes and enhancement of their cognitive abilities to the children with intellectual disability and specialized skills that facilitate the process of rehabilitation. Physical activities that bring about improvements in relation to the outside world such as dancing, play-acting, yoga and activities that provide for aesthetic stimulus like music, painting and other creative vocational inputs are some of the expected inputs being provide through these services. At the end of March, 2018 we provide special education support to 113 (Residential 59 and Non-residential 54) children with disabilities (Divyangjan).



RCI Approved Training Centre - Diploma in Education Special Education:

Asha Bhavan Centre successfully running the 3rd year of Rehabilitation Council of India recognized, the Diploma in Education in Special Education – Mental Retardation (D.Ed.Spl.Ed-MR) is a two-year intensive training programme for those interested in developing a career in special needs, with a particular focus on Mental Retardation.

This program focuses on providing students with the practical skills and knowledge they need to work with special needs individuals, providing basic care and teaching life skills, behavior moderation, and social skills. Students learn how to prepare and organize lesson plans, classroom management skills, and behavior management strategies to implement in a special needs classroom.

Asha Bhavan Centre has an extremely experienced pool of experts to train the students enrolled in this course. The training gives equal emphasis on both the theoretical and practical aspects of working with individuals on the Mental Retardation. The trainees learn through various modes like workshops, talks/lectures by experts, field visits, assignments, videos, as well as practical 'hands on' exposure, etc.



Disha (Early Intervention and School Readiness Scheme):

Asha Bhavan Centre established the Disha Center (Scheme of the National Trust) for early intervention for Person with Disability (Divyangjan) in 0-10 years of age covered under the National Trust Act. The centre started functioning from 17th July 2017 with 20 children with disabilities at Kathila campus. The aims of the project is to provide training (specifically school readiness) and counseling to both children and parents. This centre providing special educator, early intervention therapist, physiotherapist, occupational therapist and counselor for Divyangjan along with caregiver and ayas in the centre availability of a physical trainer and speech therapist in this center is also providing transportation facilities to Divyangjan.

Sahyogi (Care Associate Training Program Primary Level):

Asha Bhavan Centre start to run the Human Resource Development programme name "SAHA-YOGI" (Scheme of the National Trust). This scheme aims at setting up Care Associate Cells (CACs) to provide training and create a skilled workforce of care associates to provide adequate and nurturing care for Person with Disabilities (Divyangjan) and their families who require it. It also seeks to provide parents an opportunity to get trained in care giving if they so desire.

This year we complete a batch of 25 person of primary training for three month course. The trainees trained in orientation to areas such as Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation, Multiple Disabilities, family needs, health, nutrition, basic management in activities of daily living, assistive devices and barrier free environment, orientation and mobility sensory motor stimulation. It also included training in administering first aid care.



State Nodal Agency Centre, West Bengal (SNAC):

The National Trust itself has very limited staff and infrastructure. However, the National Trust has to fulfill its objectives and to broaden its sphere of working in every State and UT except J&K, therefore a State level representative has to be appointed in order to sustain the momentum in long run. So, The National Trust appoints State Nodal Agency Centre (SNAC) in every district of the Country and Asha Bhavan Centre is selected this year as SNAC for West Bengal.

The scheme has social objectives and has emphasis on convergence, documentation, mentoring and activating the Local Level Committees. Asha Bhavan Centre visited all the registered organization of the National Trust and also monitors the scheme for its effective implementation throughout the state. We are working closely with state government to implement the objectives of the National Trust in every corner of the state.

Niramaya (Health Insurance Scheme):

Asha Bhavan Centre run the National Trust Project Niramaya Health Scheme programme for the person with disabilities (Divyangjan). Through this scheme we reached 22 Divyangjan and enrolled them under this insurance.



Skill Development Training Program:

Asha Bhavan Centre empanelled as a trainer agency for imparting skill development training programmes of West Bengal Swarojgar Corporation Limited (W.B.S.C.L.) In collaboration with Block Development Office we organized Vocational Training programmes for Self Help Group Women and Unemployed Youth in various trade. Through this program we develop the entrepreneurship skills for self-independency.

Person with disabilities (Divyangjan) celebrated the day with various Games, Cultural Programme and many more. Dignitaries from the communities were participated in those colorful events and cheer all the participants. Our children show their abilities and conveyed the message of inclusion.



Inclusive India Campaigning: Under the banner of the National Trust organized at Kolkata on 13th August 2017. Amongst these one of the major activities is creating awareness amongst the general public, parents of Persons with Disability by organizing various workshops, seminars and conferences on these disabilities and the capabilities of such persons.

Asha Bhavan Centre as The National Trust State Nodal Agency Centre "SNAC" of West Bengal organized one-day parents training program regarding disability management, self-advocacy and government facilities for the PwDs. More than 350 people including Parents, ROs members and other stakeholder, Media persons and many dignitaries attended and graced the program. The programme organized on 26th March 2018 at Uluberia Rabindra Bhavan Auditorium from 10: 30 a.m. onward.

The one day training programme covered the following-Orientation on the 4 disabilities of the National Trust including Learning Disabilities. Availability of various support services to these persons. Training on Activities of Daily Living (ADL) and handling these persons on day to day basis. Concept of Inclusive India initiative of the National Trust.Schemes and activities of the National Trust.Self Advocacy, Awareness among the general public and Government officials about the online system of appointment of Legal Guardian through Local Level Committee.
